

AQTF EXPORT IN TED 4.06 (R2)

Revision 2 on 20th of May, 2009.

A new AQTF export has been added to Ted as an additional tool for you to comply with the new AQTF Competency Completion Quality Indicator.

This document includes:

← **New in Revision 2**

Background

Under the AQTF, RTOs are required to collect, use and report data on three Quality Indicators:

- Competency Completion, first due 30th June 2009
- Learner Engagement, first due 30th June 2010
- Employer Satisfaction, first due 30th June 2010.

At this point in time there is no plan for Ted to help you in the Learner Engagement or Employer Satisfaction indicators, software is available from the ACER website to help with these two indicators.

Information already entered into Ted can be used to calculate the Competency Completion Quality Indicator report, this document describes how Ted can prepare that report for you.

The Competency Completion Quality Indicator counts the number of enrolments and completions for each Qualification and Unit/Module. This indicator is first due by 30th of June 2009 and must contain the numbers of enrolments/completions that occurred in the 2008 calendar year.

This indicator can be queried and updated through the Competency Completion Online System (<http://rto.ncver.edu.au/>)

If you have submitted all of your 2008 training to AVETMISS (this includes funded and non-funded training) then this AVETMISS data will be used to fill in the Competency Completion Quality Indicator for you.

For RTOs who have turned off the "Report to Avetmiss" flag on some enrolments or have only been claiming funded trainees, those RTOs will need to update this Quality Indicator to take into account all training done in 2008.

If you have all funded and non-funded training in Ted, then Ted can calculate the numbers required by the Competency Completion Quality Indicator and provide you with exported files that can be directly uploaded into the Competency Completion Online System website.

The AQTF export in Ted will ignore the "Report to Avetmiss" flag and report on all training whether it is funded or non-funded.

Submission Process

The full process to submit the Competency Completion Quality Indicator is as follows:

Step 1: Logon to CCOS

Step 2: Enter data for the 2008 year

There are various possibilities in this step:

- 1) If you submitted all funded and non-funded training in your 2008 Avetmiss export then this information will have been used to pre-populate the CCOS data for you by NCVER. You may wish to compare Ted's AQTF Export numbers with those already on the CCOS system.
- 2) If Ted contains all funded and non-funded training for 2008 then you can use Ted's AQTF Export and import directly into the CCOS system.
- 3) If you are not entering all of your training into Ted then you will need to collate the information not available to Ted and combine it with Ted's numbers and manually enter the data into the CCOS system.

Step 3: Produce a report for the 2008 year

Produce a Competency Completion report for the 2008 year.

Step 4: Lodge your report

Lodge your report with your registering body, the process may differ depending on which registering body you are reporting to. I am aware of the following websites:

How to use the AQTF Export

The AQTF Export is available in Ted from version 4.06.

To run the export, click on *Export Competency Completions for 2008* under the *AQTF* menu. Ted will do the following:

- Create an *AQTF* folder inside your *Ted* folder,
- Create a *2008* folder inside the *Ted\AQTF* folder,
- Create three export files inside the *Ted\AQTF\2008* folder,
- Create a summary document inside the *Ted\AQTF\2008* folder.

The three export files created are:

- *rto.txt* – This file contains your RTO Number and Name, these details are from the Provider Details screen.
- *course.txt* – This file contains a list of courses and the number of enrollees and completions in each course during the 2008 year.
- *module.txt* – This file contains a list of modules and the number of enrollments and completions in each module during the 2008 year.

To make the the above export file information easier to read, Ted also creates a summary document with the same information.

Rules used by Ted in the AQTF Export

When counting the number of enrolments and completions in a year, Ted uses the following rules.

Rule 1: Enrolments are separated by state "The physical state/territory where the training activity occurred". Ted uses the suburb stored in the Delivery Location screen.

Rule 2: The following elements that can limit what is reported to AVETMISS are ignored:

- The "Report to Avetmiss?" checkbox is ignored, the enrolments is counted even if this is not ticked,
- All funding types are reported, this includes funded and non-funded enrolments.

Rule 3: A module **enrolment** is counted if:

- the end date is in the year of export,
- it is marked with one the following avetmiss codes:
 - 20 Competent,
 - 30 Not competent,
 - 40 Withdrawn (with Participation),
 - 51 RPL Granted,
 - 52 RPL Not Granted,
 - 53 RCC Granted,
 - 54 RCC Not Granted,
 - 60 Credit Transfer,
 - 81 Non-Assessable – Satisfactorily completed,
 - 82 Non-Assessable Withdrawn or not satisfactorily completed,
 - 90 Result Not Available

Note: That if a module has a start date in 2008 and an end date in 2009 then it is only counted as an enrolment in 2009 (the year of the end date).

Rule 4: A module **completion** is counted if:

- the end date is in the year of export,
- it is marked with one the following avetmiss codes:
 - 20 Competent,
 - 51 RPL Granted,
 - 60 Credit Transfer,
 - 81 Non-Assessable – Satisfactorily completed,

Rule 5: A course **enrolment** is counted if:

- it has at least one module that was training during the export year,
- the module has the Participation check box ticked,
- the module is not marked as 99 Did not start

Note: The same example module from Rule 3 that started in 2008 and ended in 2009 will cause the course enrolment to be counted as an enrolment in both 2008 and 2009.

Rule 6: A course **completion** is counted if:

- the status on the course enrolment is "Training Complete and Qualification Achieved"
- only counted in the "Year Qualifcation Achieved"

Note: A course enrolment is only counted as a completion in one year, but may be counted as an enrolment over a series of years.
